


15. Adding visual aids

Why use visual aids?




16. Providing your own opinion/analysis

Although it is important to show you have researched your topic carefully, it is also important that you give your own opinion and analysis in your essay.

17. A suggestions section

Although the main goal of your essay should be to prove your thesis statement, sometimes a suggestions section can be useful.

1. Suggestions should be for governments and industry, not individuals

In academic writing, suggestions should be made for *government* and *industry*. Giving suggestions for *individuals* is usually better suited for high school essays, not research papers.

2. Be detailed with your suggestions
