1. Summarizing the main points

Remind the reader of your most important arguments! Remember - the conclusion is your last chance to convince your reader that your thesis statement is true!

2. Restating the thesis statement

You should remind the reader of your thesis statement in the conclusion, but rephrase it. Look at this example:

The Japanese government should stop fingerprinting foreigners who enter Japan.



The fingerprinting of foreign nationals entering Japan should be stopped as soon as possible

only food prices that are rising - the charges for electricity, gas and water have also recently been rising.
